During the past three decades, Orange County has grown from a quiet, little known rural area to a thriving, world-renowned metropolis with more than 1 million residents. Orange County and the City of Orlando offer not only a refined downtown area, but also beautiful parks and recreational areas for outdoor sports enjoyment, over 100,000 rooms that fit the budget of all spectators, families and competitors, and attractions and theme parks that are the envy of the world.



Amway Center - Home to the Orlando Magic (NBA), Orlando Solar Bears (ECHL) and Orlando Predators (AFL), is the nation's premiere event center facility. This 750,000 square foot, state-of-the-art facility seats up to 20,000 fans and includes more than 60 suites and hospitality areas. Previous host venue for the 2012 NBA All-Star Game and 2014 NCAA Division I Men's Basketball Tournament (2nd/3rd Round Games).



Orange County Convention Center - The second largest meeting/competition facility in the country, boasting over 2.1 million square feet of flexible meeting space. The venue has been utilized by numerous sports' national governing bodies including USA Taekwondo, USA Volleyball, Amateur Athletic Union (AAU) and many more.



Orlando Citrus Bowl - Home of three premier collegiate football games, those being the Cure Bowl, Buffalo Wild Wings Citrus Bowl and Russell Athletic Bowls. This 65,000 seat venue recently underwent a \$207.7 million reconstruction that encompassed significant infrastructure improvements. Previous host venue for World Cup, Olympic Soccer and WrestleMania XXIV.



Orlando City Soccer Stadium - Beginning construction in 2015, the Orlando City Soccer Stadium is projected to be completed in 2016 as Orlando City Soccer enters its 2nd full season in Major League Soccer (MLS). This new multi-purpose stadium located in Downtown Orlando, will seat approximately 28,000, and include multiple suites and hospitality areas, restaurants and other amenities for fans.



USTA National Campus - Scheduled to open in the fall of 2016, the state-of-the-art facility located in the Lake Nona area will house the USTA's Community Tennis and Player Development divisions. Among its many features will include 100+ tennis courts, collegiate center, office space, fitness center and restaurant.
